PROCEEDINGS OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH SCHOOL BOARD

June 19, 2012

The Terrebonne Parish School Board met today at 7:00 P.M. in regular session at its regular meeting place, the Terrebonne Parish School Board Office, 201 Stadium Drive, Houma, Louisiana, with Mr. L. P. Bordelon, III, President, presiding, and the following members present: Mr. Roger Dale DeHart, Vice-President; Mr. Roosevelt Thomas, Mr. Gregory Harding, Mr. Richard Jackson, Ms. Debi Benoit, Ms. Brenda Leroux Babin, Mr. Donald Duplantis, and Mr. Hayes J. Badeaux.

ABSENT: None

Mr. Jackson led the Board and audience in the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A moment of silence was observed in memory of Toni Jo Thibodeaux, custodian at Lacache Middle School, who recently passed away.

At this time, President Bordelon recognized Mrs. Elizabeth Scurto, former Terrebonne Parish School Board Superintendent, and Ms. Marian Fertitta, Lafourche Parish School Board Member, who were in attendance at tonight's meeting.

Motion of Mr. Duplantis, seconded by Mr. DeHart, unanimously carried, the Board approved the minutes of School Board Meeting of June 5, 2012, as recorded.

Ms. Marian Fertitta, Superintendent of Catholic Schools for the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux; Mr. Dan Walker, and Mr. Ken Watkins, General Counsel for the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, addressed the Board regarding parochial transportation.

Superintendent Philip Martin then addressed the Board and audience regarding parochial transportation.

At this time, the Board recognized Amy Pirtle, student at South Terrebonne High School, for having maintained "Perfect School Attendance" from grades K-12. This honored student received commendations from the Louisiana Department of Education. A Certificate of Achievement was also presented to Amy.

The following report of the Education and Policy Committee meeting was presented to the Board with Mr. Jackson, Chairman, presiding:

Dear Members of the Board:

The EDUCATION and POLICY COMMITTEE met in the Board Room of the School Board Office, 201 Stadium Drive, at 5:00 P.M., on Monday, June 4, 2012, with the following members present: Mr. Richard Jackson, Chairman, Ms. Brenda Leroux Babin, Vice-Chairman, and Mr. Donald Duplantis. Also in attendance were Mr. L. P. Bordelon, III, Superintendent Philip Martin, and members of the staff.

Mr. Jackson called the meeting to order. The meeting began with the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Superintendent Martin presented the State/District Achievement Level Summary Reports of each grade from the Spring iLEAP/LEAP Scores (attachments). He said Terrebonne Parish ranked among the leading parishes in the state as the highest achieving. He discussed the progress district-wide as being very strong and anticipates encouraging results with District Performance Scores.

Superintendent Martin updated the Committee on the District Alternative Programs, which include East Street and Andrew Price. He explained how the restructuring and consolidation of the two programs will better serve those students assigned long-term, due to serious offenses such as drugs, weapons, battery and/or pose a danger to others. In addition, short-term referrals of students with less serious offenses will be placed in an In-School Intervention (ISI) Room, staffed by a teacher/interventionist that will work closely with school personnel to provide proactive interventions on site (see attached).

RECOMMENDATION NO. 1

The Committee recommends that the Board approve the consolidation of the East Street and Andrew Price Alternative Programs to form one (1) alternative program at East Street for students with extremely serious offenses such as drugs, weapons, battery, and/or pose a danger to others.

Dr. Arthur Joffrion, Supervisor of Federal Programs, presented revisions to policy FILE: G-2.4c Education of Students with Exceptionalities.

RECOMMENDATION NO. 2

The Committee recommends that the Board approve, as presented, the following revisions to policy FILE: G-2.4c Education of Students with Exceptionalities:

FILE: G-2.4c

EDUCATION OF STUDENTS WITH EXCEPTIONALITIES

The Terrebonne Parish School Board shall provide a free appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment to every student with exceptionalities, ages three through twenty-one, who is a resident of the geographical boundaries of the school district. Special education and related services may be provided by the School Board for eligible children under three years of age. Generally, identified children shall be screened and evaluated for eligibility to receive special educational services while receiving educational support in the regular classroom. If it is determined in the evaluation process that a child has a disability, impairment, or condition that impedes educational progress, then the child is classified according to the *Pupil Appraisal Handbook*, Bulletin 1508, guidelines and becomes eligible to receive special education services. All special education services shall be performed in accordance with the regulations outlined in Regulations for the Implementation of the Exceptional Children's Act, Bulletin 1706.

The School Board shall establish and maintain regulations and procedures in accordance with federal and state law to ensure that students with exceptionalities and their parents are provided the necessary procedural safeguards with respect to the provision of free appropriate public education by the School Board.

SECLUSION AND RESTRAINT

The School Board recognizes that, in order for students to receive a free appropriate public education, a safe learning environment needs to be provided. In doing so, the School Board also recognizes that there are circumstances in school under which reasonable and appropriate measures and techniques will need to be employed in dealing with students with exceptionalities who pose an imminent risk of harm to self or others.

The School Board fully supports the use of positive behavior interventions and support when addressing student behavior. The School Board reserves its right, however, to use physical restraint and/or seclusion consistent with state law to address the behavior of a student with an exceptionality when school personnel reasonably believe the behavior poses an imminent risk of harm to the student or others. The School Board shall not preclude the use of physical restraint and/or seclusion performed consistent with the requirements of a student's *Individualized Education Program* (IEP) or behavior intervention/management plan.

Imminent risk of harm shall mean an immediate and impending threat of a person causing substantial physical injury to self or others.

<u>Seclusion shall mean a procedure that isolates and confines a student in a</u> <u>separate room or area until he or she is no longer an immediate danger to</u> <u>self or others.</u>

<u>Seclusion room means a room or other confined area, used on an individual basis, in which a student is removed from the regular classroom setting for a limited time to allow the student the opportunity to regain control in a private setting and from which the student is involuntarily prevented from leaving.</u>

<u>Mechanical restraint means the application of any device or object used</u> to limit a person's movement. Mechanical restraint does *not* include: (1) A protective or stabilizing device used in strict accordance with the manufacturer's instructions for proper use and which is used in compliance with orders issued by an appropriately licensed health care provider; and (2) Any device used by a duly licensed law enforcement officer in the execution of his/her official duties.

Physical restraint means bodily force used to limit a person's movement. Physical restraint does not include: (1) Consensual, solicited, or unintentional contact; (2) Holding of a student by a school employee for less than five minutes in any given hour or class period for the protection of the student or others; (3) Holding of a student, by one school employee, for the purpose of calming or comforting the student, provided the student's freedom of movement or normal access to his or her body is not restricted; (4) Minimal physical contact for the purpose of safely escorting a student from one area to another; (5) Minimal physical contact for the purpose of assisting the student in completing a task or response.

<u>Positive behavior interventions and support means a systematic approach</u> to embed evidence-based practices and data-driven decision making when addressing student behavior in order to improve school climate and <u>culture</u>. <u>School Employee means a teacher, paraprofessional, administrator, support staff member, or a provider of related services.</u>

The parent or other legal guardian of a student who has been placed in seclusion or physically restrained shall be notified as soon as possible. The student's parent or other legal guardian shall also be notified in writing, within twenty-four (24) hours, of each incident of seclusion or physical restraint. Such notice shall include the reason for such seclusion or physical restraint, the procedures used, the length of time of the student's seclusion or physical restraint, and the names and titles of any school employee involved.

The director or supervisor of special education shall be notified any time a student is placed in seclusion or is physically restrained.

A school employee who has placed a student in seclusion or who has physically restrained a student shall document and report each incident. Such report shall be submitted to the school principal not later than the school day immediately following the day on which the student was placed in seclusion or physically restrained and a copy shall be provided to the student's parent or legal guardian.

<u>This policy and the guidelines and procedures maintained by the</u> <u>Superintendent and staff shall be provided to all school employees and</u> <u>every parent of a child with an exceptionality.</u>

<u>All instances where seclusion or physical restraint is used to address</u> <u>student behavior shall be reported by the School Board to the Louisiana</u> <u>Department of Education.</u>

Guidelines and Procedures

The School Board shall require the Superintendent and staff to maintain adequate written guidelines and procedures governing the use of seclusion and physical restraint of students in accordance with federal and state law, as well as regulations and guidelines promulgated by the Louisiana Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE). The School Board shall approve written guidelines and procedures regarding appropriate responses to student behavior that may require immediate intervention using seclusion and/or restraint. The written guidelines and procedures shall be provided to all school employees and every parent of a student with an exceptionality and shall include reporting requirements and follow-up procedures, including notification requirements for school officials, notification to the student's parent or legal guardian, and reporting of seclusion and restraint incidents to the Louisiana Department of Education.

Follow-Up

Following any situation resulting in the use of seclusion or restraint of a student, a *Functional Behavioral Assessment* (FBA) should be considered. If a student subject to the use of seclusion or physical restraint is involved in five (5) such incidents in the school year, the student's *Individualized Education Plan* (IEP) team shall review and revise the student's Behavior Intervention Plan (BIP) to include any appropriate and necessary behavioral supports. Documentation compiled for a student who has been placed in seclusion or has been physically restrained and whose challenging behavior continues or escalates shall be reviewed at least once every three (3) weeks.

Employee Training Requirements

The Superintendent or his/her designee shall be responsible for conducting or obtaining appropriate training programs for school personnel designed to address the use of seclusion and restraint techniques with students with disabilities. In addition, positive behavioral intervention strategies, crisis intervention, and de-escalation, as well as other procedures, may also be included in any training.

Charter Schools

Notwithstanding any state law, rule, or regulation to the contrary and except as may be otherwise specifically provided for in an approved charter, a charter school established and operated in accordance with State law, including its approved charter and the school's officers and employees, shall be subject to the School Board's policy and written procedures and guidelines regarding the use of seclusion and restraint with students with exceptionalities.
