PROCEEDINGS OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH SCHOOL BOARD

April 2, 2013

The Terrebonne Parish School Board met today at 7:00 P.M. in regular session at its regular meeting place, the Terrebonne Parish School Board Office, 201 Stadium Drive, Houma, Louisiana, with Mr. Roger Dale DeHart, President, presiding, and the following members present: Mr. Richard Jackson, Vice-President, Mr. Roosevelt Thomas, Mr. Gregory Harding, Ms. Debi Benoit, Mr. L. P. Bordelon, III, Mr. Donald Duplantis, and Mr. Hayes J. Badeaux.

ABSENT: Dr. Brenda Leroux Babin

Mr. Jackson led the Board and audience in the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

At the hour of seven o'clock (7:00 P.M.), pursuant to its official notices, the Board ceased accepting and opened bids received for an Oil, Gas, and Mineral Lease on Section 16, Township 20 South, Range 13 East.

Ms. Lydia Alleman, Purchasing Agent/Grant Specialist, opened the bid received from Theophilus Oil, Gas, & Land Services, LLC.

President DeHart then appointed an in-house committee consisting of Mr. Donald Duplantis, Chairman, Finance, Insurance, and Section 16 Lands Committee; Ms. Lydia Alleman, Purchasing Agent/Grant Specialist, and Mr. Clayton "Sonny" Lovell, Board Attorney, to evaluate the bid received from Theophilus Oil, Gas, & Land Services, LLC for an Oil, Gas, and Mineral Lease on Section 16, Township 20 South, Range 13 East and report back to the Board, with a recommendation, later in the meeting.

At this time, President DeHart gave introductions and Superintendent Philip Martin presented a plaque to three of Terrebonne Parish's 2012-2013 Students of the Year: Hannah Robert, fifth grader at Lacache Middle School, Elementary School Level Student of the Year; Hannah Weatherall, eighth grader at Montegut Middle School, Middle/Junior High School Level Student of the Year, and Cole Bergeron, twelfth grader at Terrebonne High School, High School Level Student of the Year. These students all competed for regional honors.

The Board deviated from the regular order of the agenda.

At this time, the Board received a recommendation from the in-house committee (appointed earlier in tonight's meeting) who reviewed the bid received from Theophilus Oil, Gas, and Land Services, LLC.

Motion of Mr. Thomas, seconded by Mr. Bordelon, unanimously carried, the Board accepted the bid received meeting all specifications from Theophilus Oil, Gas, and Land Services, LLC for an oil, gas, and mineral lease on Section 16, Township 20 South, Range 13 East for 183 acres in the amount of \$431.00 per acre, totaling \$78,873.00 initial consideration and a ten percent (10%) fee in the amount of \$7,887.30, with royalty to be 25.5 percent, subject to review by the Board's oil and gas consultant, the Board Attorney, and approval by the State Mineral Board, and further, authorized the Board President and Superintendent to sign any necessary documents pertaining thereto.

The Board returned to the regular order of the agenda.
