PROCEEDINGS OF THE TERREBONNE PARISH SCHOOL BOARD

OCTOBER 21, 2014

The Terrebonne Parish School Board met today at 6:00 P.M. in regular session at its regular meeting place, the Terrebonne Parish School Board Office, 201 Stadium Drive, Houma, Louisiana, with Mr. Roger Dale DeHart, President, presiding, and the following members present: Mr. Richard Jackson, Vice-President, Mr. Roosevelt Thomas, Mr. Gregory Harding, Dr. Brenda Leroux Babin, Mr. L. P. Bordelon, III, Mr. Donald Duplantis, and Mr. Hayes J. Badeaux.

ABSENT: Ms. Debi Benoit

Mr. Bordelon led the Board and audience in the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Motion of Mr. Jackson, seconded by Mr. Duplantis, unanimously carried, the Board approved the minutes of School Board Meeting of October 7, 2014, as recorded.

The following report of the Buildings, Food Service, and Transportation Committee meeting was presented to the Board with Mr. Badeaux, Chairman, presiding:

Dear Members of the Board:

The Buildings, Food Service, and Transportation Committee met at 5:00 P.M. on Monday, October 13, 2014, in the Board Room of the School Board Office with the following members present: Mr. Hayes J. Badeaux, Chairman, and Mr. L. P. Bordelon, III. Mr. Gregory Harding, Vice-Chairman, was absent. Also in attendance were Mr. Roger Dale DeHart, Board President, Mr. Richard Jackson, Vice-President, Mr. Donald Duplantis, Superintendent Philip Martin, and members of the staff.

Mr. Badeaux called the meeting to order. The meeting began with the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mr. Michael D'Angelo, P.E., Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Waterworks District #1, addressed the Committee regarding a water line servitude across the Terrebonne Parish School Board bus parking lot located at 340 St. Charles Street (see attached).

RECOMMENDATION NO. 1

The Committee recommends that the Board allow the Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Waterworks District #1 a ten foot wide "Act of Servitude" around the Terrebonne Parish School Board bus parking lot property located at 340 St. Charles Street for a proposed water line, and further, authorize the Board President to sign all necessary documents pertaining thereto.

The Committee addressed the Intergovernmental Agreement between Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government and Terrebonne Parish School Board as it relates to drainage and public use servitude on a tract of land, owned by the Terrebonne Parish School Board, located at H. L. Bourgeois High School, #1 Reservation Drive, Gray, Louisiana 70359 (see attached).

RECOMMENDATION NO. 2

The Committee recommends that the Board enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement between Terrebonne Parish Consolidated Government and Terrebonne Parish School Board as it relates to acquiring a permanent servitude and a temporary construction servitude over a tract of land, owned by the Terrebonne Parish School Board, located at H. L. Bourgeois High School, #1 Reservation Drive, Gray, LA 70359 to improve drainage and public utilities, and that the Terrebonne Parish School Board receive \$11,583.99 as compensation, and further, authorize the Board President to sign all necessary documents pertaining thereto.

Mrs. Natalie Bergeron, Director of Project LEARN-LaTerre, Inc., addressed the Committee concerning the use of Little Caillou School by Project LEARN-LaTerre, Inc. (see attached).

RECOMMENDATION NO. 3

The Committee recommends that the Board renew the current Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between Terrebonne Parish School Board and Project LEARN-LaTerre, Inc., for use of Little Caillou School, for a period of three (3) years, from October 19, 2014, to October 19, 2017, with one (1) three year option to renew said agreement, provided that the necessary insurance, non-profit status, and all other School Board policy requirements are met, and further, authorize the Board President to sign all necessary documents pertaining thereto, subject to Board attorney review.

Mr. Daniel Bruce, Jr., AIA, Cheramie and Bruce Architect, APC, addressed the Committee regarding an update of the Re-roofing Project at Village East School (see attached).

RECOMMENDATION NO. 4

The Committee recommends that the Board ratify a change order to decrease the amount of the contract for the Re-roofing Project at Village East School by \$35,000.00 for unused Provisionary Allowance, and \$5,115.00 for unused unit pricing for Tectum Decking insulated panels, for a total credit of \$40,115.00, and increase the contract time by nine (9) days, changing the completion date from August 19, 2014, to August 27, 2014, for the Re-roofing Project at Village East School, and further, authorize the Board President to sign all necessary documents pertaining thereto.
