DRESS CODE FOR BUS OPERATORS

BUS OPERATOR GROOMING

It is mandatory that operators be neat and well-groomed including personal hygiene and cleanliness. Only authorized head coverings (hats, caps) shall be permitted. Hats and caps must be worn correctly and must be removed when entering School Board buildings.

BUS OPERATOR DRESS

- 1. Belts must be worn with hemmed shorts, slacks, and jeans that have belt loops.
- 2. Shirts must be worn tucked in and not over the pants, depending on design and length. Outer garments with printing, patches, or numbering must be in good taste, not offensive or suggestive. Sleeveless shirts must have a collar. Tank tops, body shirts, string straps, midriffs, low cut shirts, and see-through shirts that expose skin are not permitted.
- 3. Shorts cannot be shorter than 4 inches above the knee. Spandex shorts and cutoff jeans cannot be worn at any time.
- 4. Shoes must enclose the foot. Sandals, flip flops, slippers, etc. are not permitted. Open toe and/or open back shoes are not allowed while driving the bus.
- 5. All forms of attire should fit comfortably, not excessively tight or excessively loose.
- NOTE: For further clarification of questions regarding grooming and dress, the Supervisor of Transportation makes the final decision whether an operator's attire or appearance is allowed.
- I.D. Pictures: Bus operators must have their I.D. pictures in plain sight when driving a school bus or on Terrebonne Parish School Board grounds.
