Good Grant writing is considerate. It puts the reader's needs and interests first by visualizing his/her desires, problems, emotions, and possible responses to your request.

To be considerate:

- Avoid and 'I' or 'we' focus
- Show interest in the reader/reviewer
- Emphasize the possible, not the impossible
