- 1. If you're not yet a registered teacher on DonorsChoose.orghttp://www.donorschoose.org/, sign up now. It will save you time when you actually post your project.
- 2. Post your project at DonorsChoose.org<http://www.donorschoose.org/ (requesting up to \$2,000 in materials).
