- May 21-23.....Grades 9-11 Final Exams

## **Here's What To Expect**

- ♦ Students in Grades 5–8 will take LEAP 2025 ELA, Math, Social Studies, and Science assessments, on the computer, from April 1–May 3. Schools will send home testing letters as it relates to their individual school's testing schedule.
- **♦** Students in Grades 3 & 4 will take LEAP 2025 ELA, Math, Social Studies, and Science assessments from April 29-May 3. Tests will be in the traditional paper/pencil format.
- **♦** Please try not to schedule any appointments during testing week. It is important for students to be at school, on time, every day. Our students and teachers have been working hard all year; we are confident that students will do their best. Thank you for your continued support.

# **Outstanding Students Receive Distinguished**





The 43<sup>rd</sup> Annual Terrebonne Science and Engineering Fair was held at the Houma Municipal Auditorium January 15, 2019. Ninety-eight (98) students in Grades 6-12 from ten (10) schools competed in the fair. In the Senior Division, Liz Diaz (H.L. Bourgeois High School) was the overall grand prize winner, and Kyle Keneker (South Terrebonne High School) was the grand prize runner-up. In the Junior Division, Olivia Marant (Mulberry Elementary) was the grand prize winner while Kaelyn Steele (Houma Junior High) was the grand prize runner-up.

A total of twenty-seven (27) students from the district placed first in their categories at the parish fair and qualified to attend the State Science and Engineering Fair that was held at Louisiana State University on March 18-20, 2019. In the senior division, students from Terrebonne High School, Maxwell Eschete placed 1st in the Engineering Mechanics category, Craig Colville placed 4th in Physics and Astronomy, and Lauren Boudreaux placed honorable mention in Animal Sciences. Guilianna Chinchilla (South Terrebonne High School) received the 1st place special award from Society of Women Engineers.

Grand Prize winners from the district level, Liz Diaz and Kyle Keneker, qualified to participate in the International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) in Phoenix, Arizona, in May. At ISEF, Liz and Kyle will compete with eighteen hundred (1,800) students from all fifty (50) states and sixty (60) countries.

### **Social Studies Fair**

The 2019 Social Studies Fair was held on January 18, 2019, at Nicholls State University. Students from eight (8) parishes (Ascension, St. James, Assumption, St. John the Baptist, Lafourche, St. Charles, St. Mary, and Terrebonne) participated in this year's fair.
