# Test Taking Tips for Parents

### Parents,

It's that time of the year again! How can you assist your child in performing at his/her best and highest achievement level? Here are a few test taking tips that can help them:

- ✓ Make sure your child gets a good night's rest each night.
- ✓ Serve your child a LIGHT, healthy breakfast each test day.
- ✓ Send your child off to school with words of praise and support.
- ✓ Make sure your child arrives to school on time.
- ✓ Avoid checking your child out of school or scheduling appointments during test week.
- ✓ Tell your child to listen and follow directions carefully.
- ✓ Remind your child to check over answers, if there is time remaining.

# HERE'S WHAT TO EXPECT

- Students in Grades 3–8 will participate in LEAP 2016 State Testing for ELA, Math, and Science during the week of April 25–29. Tests will be paper-based following similar timed guidance as last year.
- An ELA and Math session will occur on Monday through Wednesday.
- Science will be taken on Thursday.
- April 28<sup>th</sup> is reserved for make-up tests.
- During the week of May 9–3, students will participate in a Social Studies Field Test. Information on exact testing sessions/days will be provided in late April.
- Please try not to schedule any appointments during testing week. It is important for students to be at school on time every day. Our students and teachers have been working hard all year; we are confident that students will do their best. Thank you for your continued support.

As a parent of a student in Terrebonne Parish Schools, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teachers who instruct your child. Federal law (No Child Left Behind) allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner. # Science and Engineering Fair

The 40th Annual Terrebonne Parish Science and Engineering Fair was held at the Southdown Elementary School Gymnasium January 27, 2016. One hundred and nine (109) students in Grades 6-12 from thirteen (13) schools competed in the fair.

In the Senior Division, Gabrielle White (South Terrebonne High School) was the grand prize winner, and Adeline Martin (South Terrebonne High School) was the grand prize runner-up winner. Both girls qualify to participate in the State Science Fair, which will be held at Louisiana State University on March 21-23, 2016. In addition, they qualify to participate in the International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF) in Phoenix, Arizona, in May. Gabrielle and Adeline will compete with eighteen hundred (1,800) students from all fifty (50) states and sixty (60) countries.

In the Junior Division, Cade Domangue (Houma Junior High) was the grand prize winner. Cade also qualifies to participate in the State Science and Engineering Fair in March.

Twenty-two (22) Terrebonne Parish Public School students placed first in their categories and have qualified to attend the State Science and Engineering Fair in March.
