What is LEAP? It test students' knowledge and skills in English Language Arts, Math, Science and Social studies. These tests tell us whether or not a child has mastered this year's curriculum and we use the data to determine if a child is ready for the next grade level. This data follows your child until he or she graduates from high school and will be used to make decisions about placement in classes for junior high and high school. Students scoring all Mastery and Advanced will be placed in honors classes at the feeder schools.

Parents can help with preparing their children for LEAP. Follow these steps during testing and your child will be able to perform to the best of their ability.

- 1. Be well rested.
- 2. Eat a nutritious breakfast.
- 3. Dress comfortably.
- 4. Arrive to school on time.
- 5. Stay positive, take deep breaths, and relax. Know that the teachers have prepared them.
- 6. Pay attention to the test directions.
- 7. Read every answer, then choose the best one.
- 8. Check your answers if you have extra time.
- 9. Review to make sure that you answered every question before your final submission.
- 10. Schedule any appointments for after 12 noon.

Intervention Content Leader News How To Help Your Child Prepare for State Testing
